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Interpreting the Results

This test should be used in conjunction with other diagnostic tools to help you determine some of the ways in which your students are best able to learn.

- Do discuss the scores with students, for example, at your first one-onone conference.
- Most students show a "dominant" (preferred) and a "weak" (least preferred) learning style.
- Scores below 24 in any one of the three categories (Visual Preference Score, Auditory Preference Score, or Kinaesthetic Preference Score) are considered low and indicate a strong need for the student to develop strategies for maximizing the preferred style and managing the least preferred style.
- Scores of 32 or greater in all three learning styles (known as the eclectic style) indicate that the student can learn using all three styles.
