

HO-62 Multi-Paragraph Reports

A **paragraph** is a group of sentences that focus on one subject or idea. A paragraph

- has an introductory sentence that tells what the paragraph is about.
- has supporting ideas that give further information.
- ends when the author switches subjects.

In a multi-paragraph report:

- the first paragraph introduces the topic.
- the last paragraph summarizes the topic.
- the paragraphs in between present different types of information about your topic.

Think of your report as a sandwich. The first and last paragraphs are the slices of bread. In between, there are one or more paragraphs of "fillings."
