


Culture Web


You were given a web that explained the elements of a culture. You have been given a blank web that has the same areas as your informational web.


The topic is Canada and you will need to research and provide information in each area. You are looking for information that represents Canada. You need to find information that defines us and makes us special and different compared to other countries.

Canadian heraldry is a strong white and broad red cross.


National Anthems that have been created by Purcell Alcock has the soul.
