3. Saskatchewan's Cultural Diversity – Eastern Saskatchewan

Saskatchewan's provincial motto is "Multis e gentibus vires," which is Latin for "From Many Peoples Strength." The motto reminds us that people from many different cultures have helped build Saskatchewan. The First Nations and Métis were the first to live here. This set of questions is about the people who came much later from many different parts of the world. They came because they believed they could have better lives in Saskatchewan. Many of their stories are preserved in the historic places you will learn about when you find the answers to the questions. For this set of questions, all of these historic places are located in the eastern part of Saskatchewan (east of Highway 2).

2	People from different cultures have different ways of marking graves in cemeteries. What kind of grave markers were used at the Lipton Jewish Cemetery near the Town of Fort Qu'Appelle? Keyword: Lipton	Small grave houses built over the graves
3	Before Saskatchewan became a province in 1905, it was part of the North-West Territories. In what year did Marcelin and Victorine Vey homestead at the Marcel Vey Farm Yard Site east of the Town of Wakaw. Keyword: Vey	1897
4	Some immigrants had political careers after coming to Saskatchewan. Mr. Reynold Rapp, who lived in a house in the Village of Spalding, was a Member of Parliament from 1958 to 1968. Where was Mr. Rapp born? Keyword: Reynold	Russia
5	The man who built the Holmes Residence in Prince Albert apprenticed as a carpenter in his home country when he was 14 years old. In which country was he born? Keyword: Holmes	Scotland
6	Sometimes immigrants to Canada would live in Eastern Canada before they or their family moved west. In which province did the people who lived at 165 Elgin Crescent in the Town of Lumsden live before they came to Saskatchewan? Keyword: 165	Ontario

9	Sometimes Americans whose families had lived in the United States for several generations immigrated to Canada. In what year did Harvey Powell come to Weyburn from White Rock, South Dakota? Keyword: Powell	1907
10	What were the nationalities of the "Counts" who established St. Hubert's Church and Cemetery in the Rural Municipality of Silverwood near the Town of Whitewood? Keyword: Hubert	French and Belgian
