To serve the various needs of residents, stores, offices, churches, fire halls, places of entertainment and other places were constructed. The stories of these communities are reflected in the historic places you will learn about when you answer the questions below. For this set of questions, all of these historic places are located in the western part of Saskatchewan (west of Highway 2).
