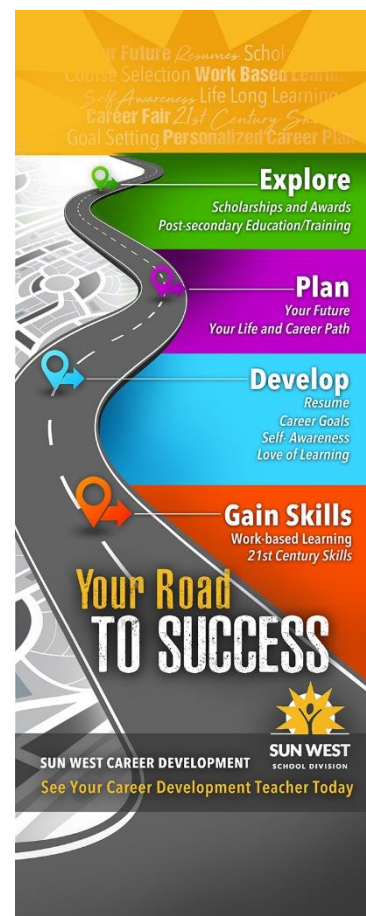

If you are enrolled as a student at U of R, U of S, or SaskPolytechnic, please see this information regarding student health plans.

The University of Regina, University of Saskatchewan and Saskatchewan Polytechnic health and dental plans are automatically applied to student fees every fall. Students can opt out of these plans by providing proof of coverage by an equivalent plan. This can provide a cost savings of about \$250! June

- Update your myBlueprint Grad Plan Portfolio with any current skills, update your resume, add any certifications or showcases, reflect on your learnings, share your portfolio with your Career Counsellor and a trusted adult, etc.
- Grade 12's may change email information in myBlueprint as prompted by the system in order to continue utilizing the resource after graduation. (We have had several students appreciate access to their resumes and planning after high school!)
- If planning a Gap Year, prepare next steps
- If planning to work, prepare next steps.

Summer

- Deadline for all University of Regina programs (excluding Indigenous Education, Visual Arts and Nursing) – Aug. 1st
- U of Saskatchewan Arts/Sciences deadline – August 15th
- Ministry of Education transcripts are due to all post-secondary institutions
- For those planning for post-secondary studies, watch email and student accounts for updates regarding registration, orientation days, etc. As well, explore the details of your post-secondary life such as need for parking passes, bus passes, extra-curricular programs, etc.

On Track To Graduate?

This is a critical time of year for **Grade 9 through 12 students and families** to refresh awareness of Saskatchewan graduation requirements. Your Career Counsellors and Principals can support if any questions as there are many factors to take into consideration when creating a Graduation and Post Graduation Plan. It is important to investigate opportunities available in order to create personalized Graduation and Post Graduation Plans. Being aware of interests, skills, future goals, and becoming familiar with current Saskatchewan Graduation requirements are helpful. [This Ministry document](#) and info below provides you with information on Saskatchewan Graduation (Regular Program). It is a good starting place for high school graduation but if your life/career plan involves post-secondary education, you will also want to investigate post-secondary requirements to ensure you have the proper entrance requirements.

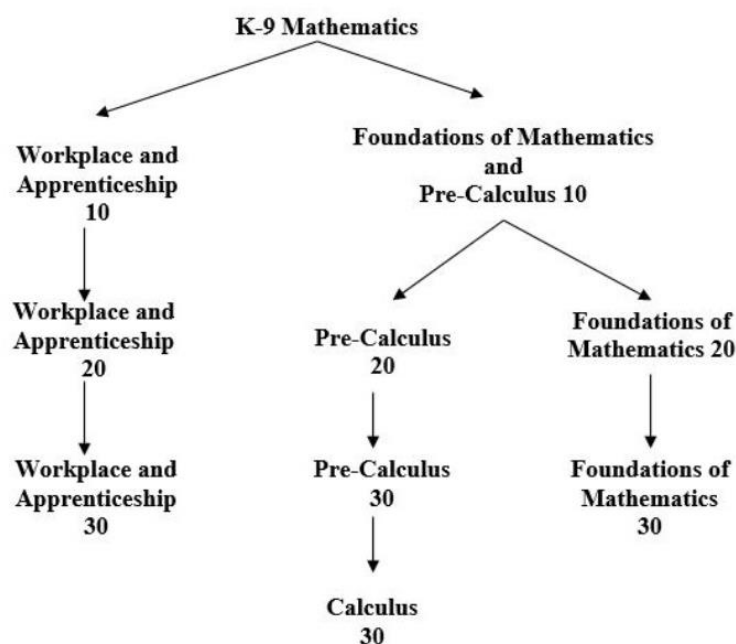
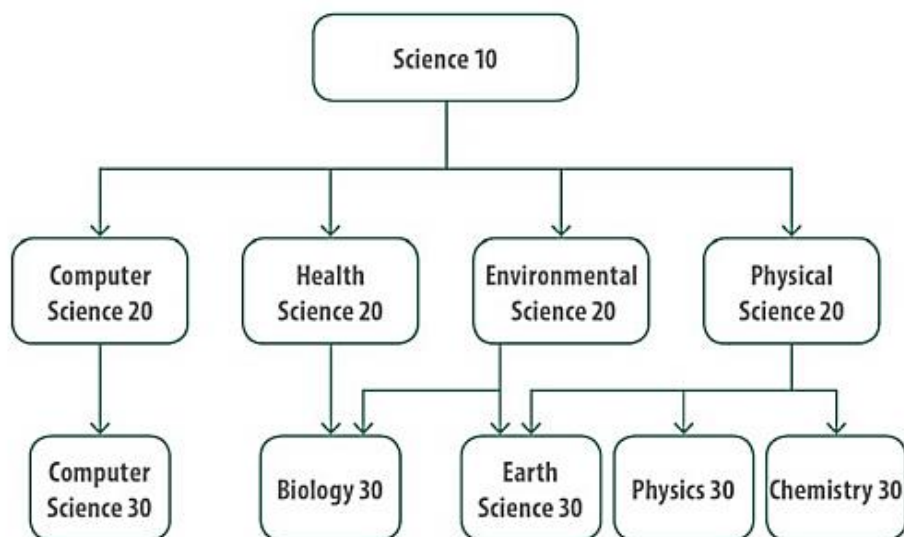

Note:

- One credit = 100 hours of classroom instruction and a minimum percentage of 50.
- Modified courses (11, 21, 31 and 10 A, 20 A, 30 A) can be used to fulfill requirements in the required courses of study, specified areas of study and electives.
- Locally developed courses (designated with an L) may be used to meet elective requirements only.
- Graduation requirements are minimum requirements for Grade 12 standing. Students may choose to exceed these requirements.
- This credit requirement change came into effect for students graduating in the year 2000.
- *Science 20 or 30 prerequisites must be met unless the student is an adult by definition of [The Education Regulations, 2019](#).

However, awareness, self reflection, research, goal setting, etc. on behalf of student and family will make for informed and personalized decisions.

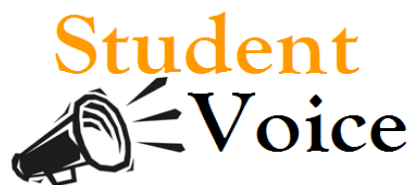

Scholarships



Applying for scholarships involves time and energy but is an incredible investment in your future.

It is impossible to inform you of all possible scholarship opportunities. However, the fact of that matter is that **significant scholarship funding goes untapped each and every year!** As students, please take some time to research and investigate possible sources of funding. **An investment of time and energy can lead to \$\$\$!**

This is a great time of year for current Grade 12 students to create accounts on various scholarship websites. Doing so will provide customized information as to potential scholarships of interest based on student involvements. A few resources to consider:

[Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry Scholarship](#) are awarded to 120 students who complete the Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship passport each year. Schools nominate a potential candidate and winners are announced in June. Many Sun West students received this scholarship! Congratulations!
