

Earn high school credits while learning a trade

Are you a high school student who is detail-oriented and passionate about agriculture?

Parts Technician 30 (PT30) might be for you! Parts technicians play a key role in keeping the ag industry up and running - and it is a career in demand!

Course Overview

PT 30 consists of 3 parts: online theory, practical learning at a work placement, and a boot camp at Sask Polytechnic.

Online Course Work and Theory	50 hrs
Work Placement (Ag Dealership)	40 hrs*
Boot Camp (Sask Polytechnic)	10 hrs

* If you can not attend boot camp, you simply complete 50 hrs at your work placement.



In PT30, you'll learn about sourcing, tracking and managing parts and gain firsthand experience at an ag equipment dealership - all while earning a 30 level high school credit.

What do I need to know about PT 30?

- Available to high school students across Saskatchewan
- Can fit with your current school schedule (Semester 1)
- The DLC's Ag Coordinator will find your work placement at a nearby ag equipment dealership
- It's FREE, thanks to the generous support of our partners
- Talk to your guidance counsellor to request PT 30


Take Our Kids To Work Day 2021 – Virtual!



- A. **Campus Visits** are an excellent way for students to learn more about a potential post-secondary institutions while still in high school. Please keep an eye on websites of the post-secondary institutions you may be interested in visiting. There are many opportunities, particularly for Grade 11's and 12's throughout the year with many offered this fall.
- B. [See Your Future Career Fair](#) is being held in Saskatoon on November 2nd for schools in the northern part of the province and November 3rd for schools in the south.
- C. **Post-Secondary Application Process for Colleges:** For any students interested in applying for colleges such as Saskatchewan Polytechnic, **the time to apply is now** (generally speaking). For example, be sure to apply early for any Saskatchewan Polytechnic programs where admission is NOT based on a competitive admission. Grade 12 students can apply for these types of programs now. Failure to apply early could delay your potential start date by a year or more.
- D. **Post-Secondary Pre-Requisites:** Understanding pre-requisites can assist students as they select classes and plan for post-secondary education. Investigate and plan forward!

As well, some of our teachers are supporting students with **Career Safety Education** training.

[Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry Scholarship](#) are awarded to 120 students who complete the Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship passport each year. 
