

#### Monthly Timeline for Grade 12 Students:

(All students have a personalized life/career plan. This timeline is to be used as a general guideline for some SK focused updates. Dates are subject to change. Please peruse various sections of this newsletter for further life/career information.)

#### **October**

- Connect with your school's Career Counsellor
- Continue life/career investigations (high school, post secondary, apprenticeship, work, gap year, etc.)
- Continue to explore interests, develop skills, etc. Track using myBlueprint Grad Plan
- Register for Virtual and/or in-person Open Houses, Tours, Webinars of interest, etc.
- Begin applying to programs of interest as applications dates become available such as:
  - U of Regina / SK Polytech <u>SK Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing</u> (SCBScN) application opens October 1. The deadline to apply depends on application. Prospective Student Info Sessions will be held virtually at specific dates/times starting in October.
  - SK Polytech <u>Competitive</u> (high demand) Program application begins October 1<sup>st</sup>
    - (Combined Laboratory and X-Ray Technology, Dental Hygiene, Medical Lab Technology, Medical Radiologic Technology, Practical Nursing, etc.)
  - SK Polytech Competitive Entry Program application begins October 1<sup>st</sup>

#### **November**

- Continue researching opportunities in alignment with your life/career plan.
- Access your Allies! (Talk to Career Counsellors, Teachers, Parents, Family, Friends about possibilities)
- Continue to research, prepare, and apply for scholarships.
- Many Universities offer Early Admissions and Early Entrance Scholarships. Watch deadlines!
- Watch deadlines and apply for Residence such as:
  - Apply for Residence at University of Saskatchewan November 1<sup>st</sup>
- Register for events to support life/career planning such as;

#### **December /January**

- Prepare for Semester 1 final exams.
- Review timetable for Sem 2 and talk to Career Counsellor/Principal about any potential adjustments.
- Continue to apply for programs of interest.
- Continue to research, prepare, and apply for scholarships.
- Many Universities offer Early Admissions and Early Entrance Scholarships. Watch deadlines!
- If post-secondary institutions require official transcripts after January exams, be sure to order them from the Ministry of Education. <u>https://www.k12.gov.sk.ca/etranscript/</u>

#### **February**

- Connect with your school's Career Counsellor
- Continue applying for scholarships.
- February 15<sup>th</sup> is a 'common' deadline for competitive entry colleges at SK Post-secondary institutions.
- Check deadlines for out of province schools.
- SKPoly High Demand program deadline February 15<sup>th</sup>



#### <u>March</u>

- Continue applications
- Official Ministry Transcripts due to SKPoly for Nursing and high demand programs March 1<sup>st</sup>

#### <u>April</u>

- Continue to apply for programs of interest
- Apply for local scholarships check with your Career Counsellor, School Principal, etc. for details so you do not miss deadlines.

#### May

- Connect with your school's Career Counsellor
- If interested in summer or full-time/part-time, etc. employment, begin to investigate job opportunities, update resume, brush up on interview skills, etc.
- For those planning for post-secondary studies, watch email and student accounts for updates regarding registration, orientation days, etc.
- Update your myBlueprint Grad Plan Portfolio with any current skills, update your resume, add any certifications or showcases, reflect on your learnings, share your portfolio with your Career Counsellor and a trusted adult, etc.

#### June

- Update your myBlueprint Grad Plan Portfolio with any current skills, update your resume, add any certifications or showcases, reflect on your learnings, share your portfolio with your Career Counsellor and a trusted adult, etc.
- Grade 12's may change email information in myBlueprint as prompted by the system in order to continue utilizing the resource after graduation. (We have had several students appreciate access to their resumes and planning after high school!)
- If planning a Gap Year, prepare next steps
- If planning to work, prepare next steps.

Oct 30 – Nov 5 is <u>Skilled Trades and Technology</u> <u>Week in Saskatchewan</u>. What a great opportunity to explore opportunities in the skilled trades! This is a great time to ask your Career Counsellor about Apprenticeship Credits.

#### REGISTER FOR THE SASKATCHEWAN YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

Any Grade 10 to 12 students interested in pursuing the skilled trades have an opportunity to enroll in the <u>Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Program</u>. Please speak to your Career Counsellor for details. This is basically an extra-curricular career investigation opportunity with huge benefits to students. In addition to exploring a trade or trades of interest, successful completion means future waiver of indenturing fee, no charge for Level 1 technical training, and 300 hours of trade time credit.

#### **EXPLORE VARIOUS ONLINE OPPORTUNITIES**

Continue your life/career investigations as informed decisions are the key to future happiness. Whether you are wondering about employment, a gap year, college, university, travel, scholarship, resume building, portfolio building, etc. your Career Counsellor can help connect you to various online supports for you and your family. This newsletter is jam-packed with ideas for virtual life/career investigation opportunities.

#### DEVELOP/REVISIT HIGH SCHOOL COURSE PLANNING:

Grade 9-12 students and families should be very familiar with Saskatchewan graduation requirements. Your Career Counsellors and Principals can support if any questions as there are many factors to take into consideration when creating a Graduation and Post Graduation Plan, Being aware of aware of interests, skills, future goals, and becoming familiar with current Saskatchewan Graduation requirements are helpful. <u>This Saskatchewan High School Credit</u> <u>Options document</u> provides info on Saskatchewan Graduation. As well, details found in September's Student Career Newsletter will support the planning process.

#### UTILIZE myBLUEPRINT

myBlueprint is available to Grade 9 through 12 students in support of our Graduation and Post Graduation Plan. The transition to post-secondary

can be daunting for students (and their parents!). Whether they are entering a college, university program, apprenticeship, the workforce, volunteering, planning a gap year, etc., students will inevitably experience drastic changes. Our Career Counsellors can help support the use of myBlueprint as a tool for life/career planning and investigation. This tool can help students/families:

- 1. Research the high school courses that are required for their programs of interest.
- 2. Research post-secondary programs so they are aware of important dates and resources available to them (i.e., scholarships, bursaries, moving dates, etc.)
- 3. Develop a budget to finance their post-secondary pathway, etc. **Did You Know? Parents can gain access to myBlueprint!**

TAKE OUR KIDS TO WORK (TOKW) DAY 2022 Wednesday, November 2, 2022 for Grade 9 Students



ATTN: Grade 9 Career Education Students and Parents/Guardians

**Take Our Kids To Work** is a unique program for students initiated by The Learning Partnership and now supported by The Students Commission of Canada. It is a job shadow activity for Career Ed 9 students to help them make connections to the world of work and begin thinking about their own future. It involves the student **SHADOWING** a parent/guardian in a suitable place of employment for one day. This is a fantastic life/career exploration experience for many reasons:

\*It helps students understand the importance of staying in school.

\*It allows students to acquire an understanding of the skills necessary in a given occupational area.

\*Students can explore the world of work in a practical way and make connections between their education and future.

\*It provides for a shared experience with a parent and helps students gain insight into the work roles of their parents and the need to make a living and positively contribute to society. \*It helps connect employers to today's youth.

Students will engage in a number of virtual learning experiences during Career Education class in and around TOKW Day in support of the following outcomes:

<u>CG 9.1</u> Utilize career information to construct an organized plan of career building which reflects an attitude and expectation of lifelong learning.

LW 9.1 Assess one's own abilities to seek, obtain, and/or create work through researching successful strategies and applying them to one's life.

LW 9.2 Use acquired knowledge to create a plan for life and work based on one's preferred future.

The month of November is a great time for Grade 9 students to initiate career conversations with their parents/guardians to help make connections to the world of work while beginning to think about their future. Some possible conversation starters include:

- Why did you choose this job?
- What do you like about this job?
- What do you dislike about it?
- What is involved in a typical day at work?
- What's the hardest part about your job? Or, what is biggest challenge?
- What are advancement/growth opportunities?
- What's one thing that most people don't know about this career?
- Is there anything you wish you would have done to better prepare yourself for the world of work?
- What skills/characteristics make a person successful at this job?
- What classes can I take to help prepare me for a job in this field?
- What skills are useful for this job?
- Does this job/career align with our family lifestyle? Why/why not?
- What hopes/dreams do you have for me as I graduate from high school and transition to the world of work?

A. **Campus Visits** (Virtual or in person) are an excellent way for students to learn more about potential post-secondary institutions while still in high school. These learning opportunities help tremendously in making post-secondary related decisions. Please keep an eye on websites of the post-secondary institutions you may be interested in. There are many opportunities, particularly for students throughout the year with many offered in the fall.



- **B.** <u>See your Future Career Fair</u> is open to current Grade 11 and 12 students. It will be held on Nov 7<sup>th</sup> in Saskatoon and Nov 8<sup>th</sup> in Regina from 9:45AM 3:00PM.
- C. **Post-Secondary Application Process for Colleges:** For any students interested in applying for colleges such as Saskatchewan Polytechnic, the time to apply is now (generally speaking). For example, be sure to apply early for any Saskatchewan Polytechnic programs where admission is NOT based on a competitive admission. Students can apply for these types of programs now. Failure to apply early could delay your potential start date by a year or more.

- E. **Post-Secondary Pre-Requisites:** Understanding pre-requisites can assist students as they select classes and plan for post-secondary education. Investigate and plan forward!

## **Scholarships**




Applying for scholarships involves time and energy but is an incredible investment in your future.

<u>Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship</u> is awarded to ALL Saskatchewan grade 12 graduates who are enrolled in a Saskatchewan post-secondary institution in a recognized program of study. This is worth \$500/year up to a maximum of \$2,000 and is automatically applied to tuition.



Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry Scholarship are awarded to 120 students who complete the Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship passport each year. Schools nominate a potential candidate and winners are announced in June. Many Sun West students received this scholarship! Congratulations! 
