## Genius Hour "Mini Project" Guide Sheet

You will need to present the information below in a mini presentation to students in our class. Your presentation should last about 2 minutes.

## The Process

- 1. Class I (I hour)
  - a. Learn about Genius Hour
  - b. Brainstorm possible topics for you
  - c. Narrow your choices down to "The Final Four"
  - d. Pick one Topic (by next day)
- 2. Class 2 Research (I hour)
  - a. Use the double journal provided
  - b. Use people, internet, books or other resources tin research
  - c. Keep track of what you find some someone could find it again.\*DOCUMENT.
  - d. Record your thoughts, reactions, questions on your double journal.
- 3. Class 3 Group Discussions (30 min)
  - a. In groups, share what you have learned about your topic, where you learned it and what else you need to learn before your

- presentation. (2 minutes of sharing then 2 minutes of feedback).
- b. Write down what your peers suggest.
- 4. Class 4 Final Research (30 min)
  - a. Go back to earlier steps and focus on the areas of interest after feedback from your classmates. Finish up the research!
- 5. Class 5 Presentation Creation (30 min)
  - a. Chose a presentation tool (multimedia or live). You can either:
    - Have a video presentation of your answers to the questions below available and people can watch it during the gallery walk.
    - Create a PowerPoint using the template to guide your presentation during the gallery walk.
    - Something else (make sure you get it approved by your teacher)
- 6. Class 6 Presentation (30 min)
  - a. Have video/media presentations loaded up and ready to go at stations.
  - b. Half of the class should present for the first 15 minutes and have students walk to the topics that interest them.
  - c. Second half of the class presents for the last 15 minutes.

- 7. Class 7 Reflection
  - a. Complete a reflection
  - b. Decide if you will use this for your Genius Hour Project or if you will start again with a new focus.
